## 1. Statement of Program Goals and Objectives:

- A) Summer Repertory Theatre (SRT) is a complete and extensive practicum in all aspects of stage production; singing, dancing, stagecraft, costuming and theatre management are taught through a comprehensive program of rehearsal and public performance for the career-oriented student. Students will learn to perform effectively as a member of a repertory theatre company while working on multiple shows simultaneously.
- B) Upon successful completion of this program, the student will be able to:
  - 1. Effectively perform fundamental techniques of in the preparation and performance of multiple theatrical productions before a paying public audience.
  - 2. Work safely and competently with common tools, equipment and materials associated with regional repertory theatre.
  - 3. Define and demonstrate knowledge of a professionally organized theatre company, including day-to-day operations and safety procedures.
  - 4. Work productively as a member of a professional production team.
  - 5. Recognize the relationship between all elements of professional theatre design and technology, including scenery, scenic painting, properties, performance, electrics and sound.

### 2. Catalog Description:

The Theatre Arts: Repertory Theatre Certificate of Achievement is designed for individuals who are interested in learning the professional skills required to work in the regional theatre, summer stock and national tours. This 12 unit program prepares students to work on multiple shows at a time as a stage hand/running crew, wardrobe assistant, production assistant or ensemble actor. The full time student can complete this program in one semester.

Regional theatres, summer stock companies and national tours require professionals who understand how to work in fast paced, intensive, creative environment. This program requires students to put theory to the test and work continuously under the professional repertory theatre system.

Seasonal or full time jobs are plentiful throughout the country. Students receive the technical training they need to qualify for entry level jobs in this filed. Successful completion to this certificate also proves to perspective employers that students have the experience they are looking for.

### 4. Background and Rationale:

This certificate will prepare students for entry level jobs in the theatre industry in a single summer session. All of the courses already exist. By creating this certificate, we will be formally acknowledging our students' accomplishments and provide them with an additional level of credibility to add to their resume in order to make them more appealing job candidates to future employers.

At Santa Rosa Junior College, faculty members with discipline expertise develop all certificates and majors. For AA-T and AS-T degrees, faculty members with appropriate expertise determine which courses align with the C-ID descriptors. The Supervising Administrator(s) then review the application to assure that it aligns with Chancellor's Office criteria for approval and SRJC guidelines for financial feasibility and community need. The Majors Review Committee reviews the application and suggests any changes to assure than all guidelines have been observed. The item is then placed on the Curriculum Review Committee agenda for approval, and when approved, is submitted for approval by the Board of Trustees.
